School Streets Important Update

Parents/Carers have recently been sent a link to the school website, updating you all about changes that are coming to the roads by our school.



Ealing School Streets

The new scheme will commence on 2nd September 2020. Parts of Perimeade, Federal, Fraser and Sarsfield Roads will be closed to traffic between 8.15-9.15am and 2.45-3.45pm, Monday to Friday during term time. Enforcement will be via ANPR camera.

Parents will not be allowed to drive down the above-named roads between these hours without a permit. Driving through the scheme during operational hours will result in vehicles being issued with a Penalty Charge Notice.


Sugar Smart School
