Thankyou to you, our Perivale parents for your patience, understanding and support of the school over what has been a year of trials, transition, and finally triumph!

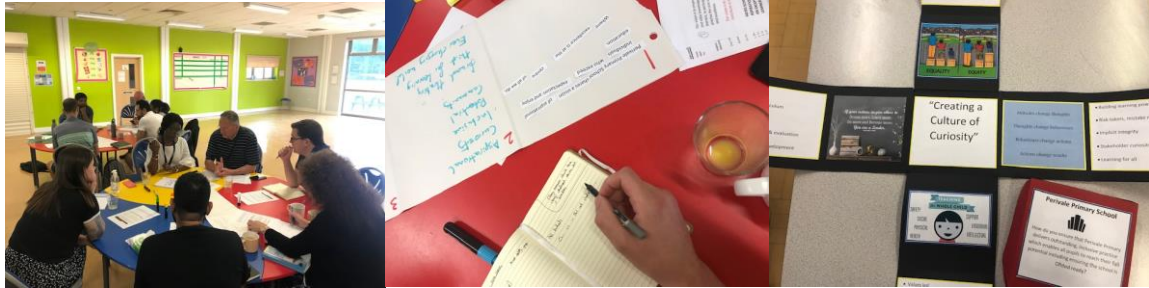
We wish everyone a restful and peaceful summer break, and look forward to more Perivale success in 2022 – 2023.

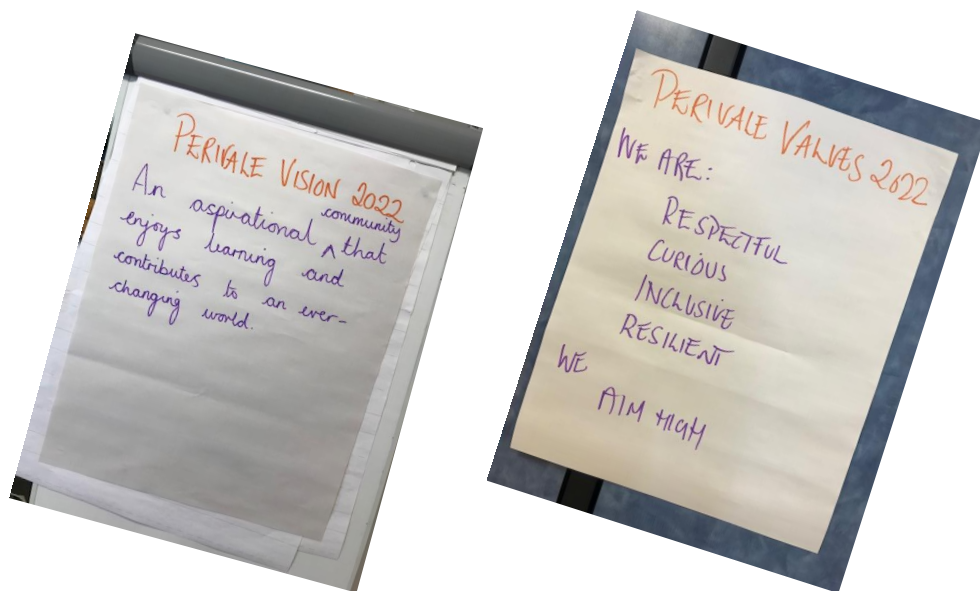

Governor newbies

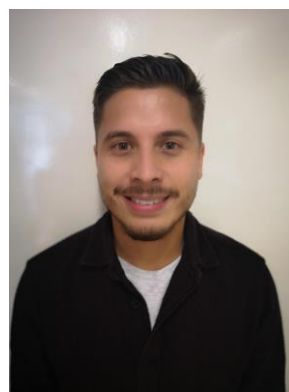
