Welcome back to the Summer Term!

Maths

This term the children will continue exploring angles. They will practise how to measure angles from a point using a protractor. They will then move on to position and direction where they will learn to plot given coordinates, draw shapes. In addition to this they will look at translation and lines of symmetry. We will then recap decimals, measurement and volume. Finally, the children will practise converting units of measure.

Writing

This half term the children will be studying Anthony Browne's 'Zoo' where they will be writing their own narrative from a different perspective.

In celebration of the 75th anniversary of the Windrush, we will be exploring the journey that was taken in June 1948. The children will then create their own poems using figurative language.

Journey's - Trade

In this unit, the children will find out about the UK's global trade links, investigating where everyday products come from and the journeys they take to our homes. The children will also map the journeys taken by items, and research the pros and cons of buying local or imported goods.

Science

Animals including Humans

The term the children will be learning about the life cycle of mammals. They will look at the key stages (the baby, the young stage and the independent stage). They will then recap the gestation of mammals from our living things in their habitat's unit. While explore gestation, they will be learning about the process of a baby maturing inside a uterus between conception and birth. The children will also learn about puberty and how a child's body changes when they become an adult.
